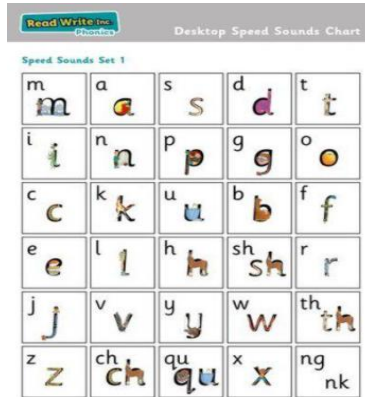


## Read, Write Inc – Home Learning – 11– Set 1 – Double consonants

Do you know all of your set 1 sounds?



Sometimes when we see 2 letters that are the same together then they make the same sound. Some examples are:

m	mm
s	ss
d	dd
p	pp
b	bb
f	ff
l	ll
z	zz
